Corpora

Corpora can be defined as "a collection of naturally occurring, computer-readable texts, often comprising many millions of words, which is considered more or less representative of a particular domain of language use" (Hyland, 2013, p. 248).

Formulaic Sequences

- It is a broad term that covers various lexical units including idioms, proverbs, collocations, lexical bundles, and conventionalized expressions (Schmitt & Carter, 2004).
- Colligations can be defined as the environment in which a word would be used, what words are connected to it, and what the grammatical patterns are (Sinclair 1996, 1999, 2004; Hoey 1997a, 1997b, as cited in Hoey & O'Donnell, 2008).
- Collocations can be defined as what words co-occur together or word associations (Hoey, 2014).

Connection of corpora to academic writing

- Understanding of multiword expressions define the writer's linguistic fluency (Hyland, 2012).
- Being able to choose certain phrases over others helps to control academic discourse (Hyland, 2012).
- More experienced writers use formulaic language.
- Learner corpus can be used to check student's errors.

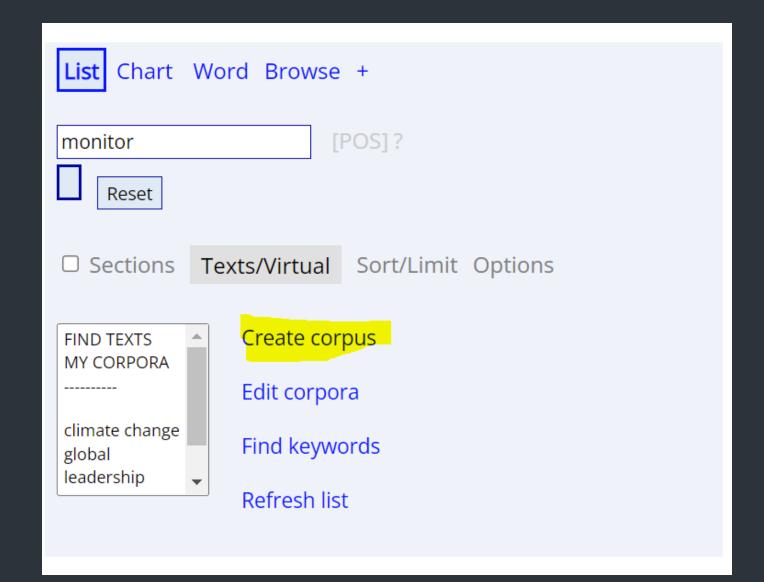

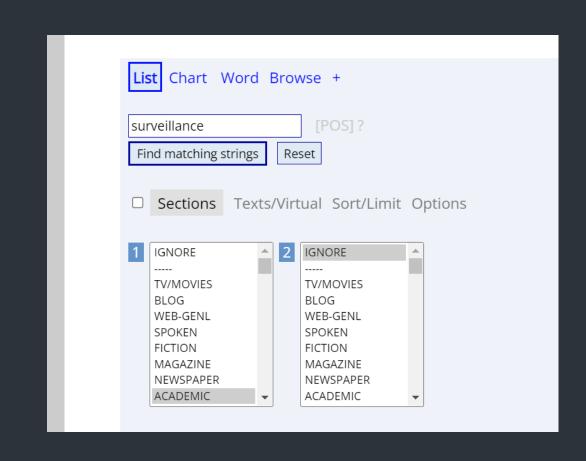
Creating A Vocabulary List

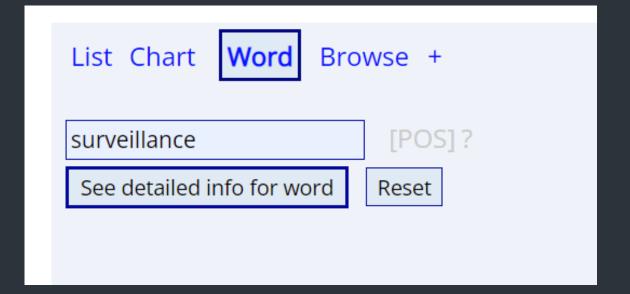

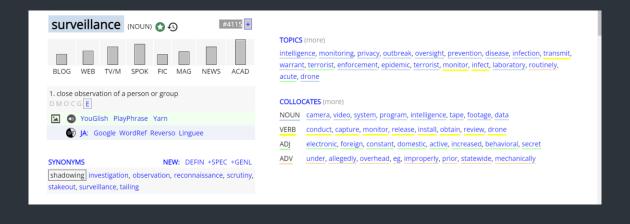

- Links to translation sites.
 - Linguee (kanji corpora), Reverso(translated words in context), WordRef (English Japanese Dictionary)
- Links to video corpora.
 - Yarn(entertainment oriented), Youglish,Playphrase

Academic Phrase Bank

- The academic phrase bank provides phrases to help with dissertation writing and other academic writing. The phrases are broken into separate headings based on purpose (Morley, 2014).
- For this essay 'being cautious' would be the most useful heading. The section 'being cautious when giving explanations', and 'devices that distance the author from a proposition' are useful.
- Highlighting the sections to look at could prevent students from being overwhelmed or these items could be added to the assignment sheet.

For	Against
Control of crime (Does surveillance make it easier to catch criminals?)	Invasion of privacy (How can your personal information be used against you? Do you want companies to be able to read your text messages? Can people find where you live? (GPS)
Improved customer service (Amazon calculating user preferences 'You might like') * See an ad on Facebook for something you bought on Amazon. (data profiles)	Costly (How expensive is a surveillance system?)
Ability to monitor and respond to national issues (e.g., the spread of coronavirus, disasters)- Track where confirmed cases have been and their contacts. (Make sure you can prove this though. Underreporting is a huge problem)	Issues of data safety (How might other people access your information? Leak your passwords?)

Argument Essay Frame

- Introduction
 - Define key terms (surveillance, privacy)
 - Explain why the reader should care about the issue/ Why the issue is debated
 - Thesis: Transition+ other side's position, your position + two predictors
- Body Paragraph 1
 - ► First supporting point
 - Give more details about the point
 - Example
 - How does this point prove your position?

Argument Essay Frame

- Body Paragraph 2
 - Second supporting point
 - Give more details about the point
 - Example
 - ► How does this point prove your position?
- Body Paragraph 3
 - Counter argument (one point from the other side)
 - Explain why that argument is not important or is not strong
 - Give example to prove your points
 - Restate why the counter argument wasn't strong or ways to address the counter argument

Argument Essay Frame

- Conclusion
 - Restate the thesis
 - Restate main points
 - Explain why it was important to talk about the issue
 - Add a prediction, recommendation, or final comment (no new information)

Conclusion

- It is important to understand vocabulary load when choosing essay topics
- If the essay topic cannot be chosen, then it is important to break down the topic in a way that helps students succeed.
- Planning step by step and providing sample essays can help students.
- Teaching how to search corpora can help students on future assignments.

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
